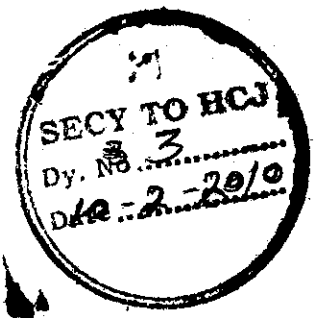

Appeal to CJ for action against negligence

QUETTA: A woman was electrocuted, two men and five children were wounded in Killi Rakhpara, Zhob, when already snapped 11kws wires touched nearby poles and wires due to high velocity of wind on Monday night.

According to sources 11 kwts wires had snapped from a pole on 18th December, 2009. The inhabitants of the area informed QESCO officials many a time of the dan-

gling wires but they didn't fix them, as a result the dangling wires touched other wires and polls in the village killing one woman and injuring two men and five children. The woman was identified as Bibi Sadia and the injured men as Payo Khan and Talib.

Payo Khan was saved after treatment at Civil Hospital, Zhob, but the other serious patient Talib was rushed to Quetta Civil hospital in emergency as he was reported to be in critical condition.

The hospital sources confirmed that five children were also saved after they were brought to Civil Hospital, Zhob.

Meanwhile Rakhpara villagers held a protest rally in front of Tehsil and Press Club, Zhob. They were holding placards and chanted slogans against the SDO and improper work of the QESCO technical staff. They also appealed to the Chief Justice of Pakistan, Iftikhar Mohammad Chaudhry, to order an inquiry.
